The two museums that I decided to look up were Detroit Institute of Art or DIA <https://www.dia.org/> and The Charles H. Wright Museum <https://www.thewright.org/>. Starting with DIA, they have two groups of memberships such as Associate membership and Auxiliary Group membership. You can click learn more to learn more information on the membership before you join. The Auxiliary Group membership is for Foundations like Associates of the American Wing and the Associate range from Individual to Society of Associates. I had to go to the menu and click support on their website to find Join membership and there is a join today button to get started. The Charles H. Wright Museum you have to go to the drop menu and click Give and then click memberships. To purchase membership at the DIA you have to click join today and click a membership you want and you are taken to a page where you place a membership order and then put in your information.

The Charles H. Wright museum don't go into details about their memberships like the DIA. It looks pretty simple, whichever membership you want you can click the plus sign and it drop down to a small description of the memberships. Then you click the button that says "Get X Membership". For College student membership, it cost for one year is \$25 and however many years you want the price increase. Also you can send it as a gift to someone. To find the DIA membership it was easy to find were as Charles H. Wright museum it took some searching to find it and it was under the menu Give.
